

Collection Statement – Healthcare Professional Engagement

The Medicines Australia Code of Conduct (**Code**) requires your name, details of the services, activities, events you engaged in, attended, or provided (**Services**), and the amount you were paid (or the value of the benefits you received) for doing so, to be published on the CSL company website and/or the Central Repository System (**CRS**).

The CRS is a publicly available, consolidated database of all reportable payments made by each of Medicines Australia's members, each for three years from the date of publication of that information.

CSL collects your personal information when you are engaged by it to provide the Services or where you have attended one of CSL's events. Where a transfer of value is made, the following personal information about you will be published in the CRS and/or CSL's website:

- your name and profession,
- your business/practice address,
- a description of the Services provided under the agreement,
- a description of the event or activity the Services related to,
- the amount of the financial payment, if any, you received from CSL under the agreement for provision of the Services,
- the amount of the financial payment or transfer of value, itemised by, air travel, accommodation costs (room rate) and registration fee, if any, paid by CSL and/or reimbursed to you to provide the Services, and
- any financial payments made to third parties as directed by you in relation to the agreement.

CSL uses your information to facilitate the performance of the Services and to pay you or to provide you with a transfer of value for those Services and to give you an opportunity to check any information we hold about you before we publish that information.

CSL may disclose your personal information:

- to Medicines Australia or Pacific Commerce Pty Ltd (as the operator of the CRS) for the purpose of operating, maintaining, and including information in the CRS; and
- to Medicines Australia to enable it to record and publish reportable payments, discuss specific reportable payments with its members, carry out analytics (including for the purpose of detecting trends in reportable payments) for internal use by Medicines Australia, and to aggregate information to derive insights.

If you do not provide us with this information, then we will not be able to engage you to perform the Services.

Our Privacy policy includes important information about how we collect, use, and disclose your personal information, how you can access or seek correction of your personal information, how you can complain about a breach of the Australian Privacy principles and how we deal with a complaint of that nature.

Healthcare Professional's (HCP) personal information will be handled at all times in accordance with CSL's Privacy Policy. CSL will give HCPs reasonable opportunity to review and make corrections to data proposed to be published by CSL and may contact HCP at their email address set out in the HCP Engagement Detail (if any), for that purpose.
